



HIV prevention starts with **ME**:

ENDING THE HIV EPIDEMIC TOGETHER

- Any woman who has sex is at risk of HIV infection, no matter her race, ethnicity, age, or sexual orientation. Protect yourself and your partner every time by using a condom.
- If you do not have HIV and your partner does, talk to your doctor about pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP). PrEP is a daily pill that can reduce your risk of getting HIV.
- Never share needles, syringes, or other injection equipment.
- Help fight the stigma! Support family and friends living with HIV or AIDS. Inform others that you cannot get HIV from things like the air, toilet seats, or hugs.
- The only way to know if you have HIV is to get tested.

24.3% of new HIV diagnoses are female

28.6% of new AIDS diagnoses are female

2,197 women in Duval live with HIV

1,227 women in Duval live with AIDS

Heterosexual contact is the biggest risk factor among women

18.1% of women with HIV are not receiving treatment
